HISTORY OF THE CHURCH IN THE UNITED STATES

The course offers a historical overview of Catholicism in the United States, from its Hispanic roots and indigenous reception to evangelization in the southeastern part of the country. It analyzes the influence of Puritan and non-Catholic traditions within the Anglo-Saxon context. It also explores the emergence of a Hispanic consciousness and pastoral ministry within a context of increasing cultural pluralism within the Church.
